Bandology Releases New Poster on Benefits of Music

Numerous studies reflect the correlation between music education and improved mental health, academic achievement and social skills. Through these infographics, Bandology seeks to educate people on the long-term benefits that can result from music education.

"And the reason we do that is because we have seen firsthand the difference music can make in a person's life. But it's not just anecdotal evidence – there are studies that prove its benefits."
