Emerging Educator to Conduct Local Youth at Music Camp

Guelph, Ontario, May 7, 2026 – Music non-profit Bandology is pleased to welcome Emily Peterman, local teacher and oboist, who will be joining Bandology this summer to serve as Music Director for Band Camp Guelph.

Peterman has been teaching classroom music, both in Canada and abroad, for half a decade. Inspired by her own experiences with music, she completed her Bachelor of Music at Wilfrid Laurier University, followed by her Bachelor of Education at Queen’s University.

Peterman began her teaching career at the Wembley High Technology College in London, England where she was recognized for strengthening the music program through curriculum redesign and ensemble creation. She teaches in the Upper Grand and Waterloo Region school boards, where she has taught band, voice and composition, as well as directing several ensembles. She has worked as a tutor within the Laurier Faculty of Music, in the faculty at the National Music Camp of Canada and taught privately at the Kitchener Academy of Music.

“Emily is a wonderful educator and we’re really thrilled to have her at Band Camp this summer,” said Sandy Wright, Education Manager and Head of Programming at Bandology. “Our experience in Guelph is always special and we’re excited to see Emily make her mark at camp.”

This will be Bandology’s third year running camp in Guelph. Past directors for Band Camp Guelph include Allen Carter, conductor of the Guelph Symphony

Bandology's Band Camp runs in Guelph from July 27-31 at the University of Guelph. Band Camp is also offered in Kitchener-Waterloo from July 6-10 and in Halton during the weeks of July 20-24 and August 10-14.
